Coming of Age:

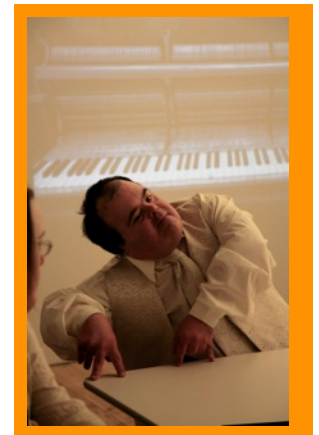
A Seminar Day at Tate Modern
